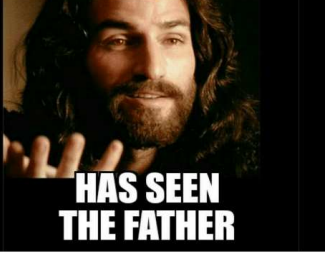

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY! БЛАГОСЛОВЕННОГО ДНЯ БАТЬКА!

What kind of Dad do you have? Is he the "strong but silent type" that works hard to support his family, but leaves most of the family matters to Mom? Is he never there? Or seldom around unless there is a critical need? Is he always there? Helping around the house? Playing with his family and travelling, camping? Is he a no-nonsense kind of guy? Maybe "mean"? Is he awkward when other Dads get together or is he a "cool" Dad? Is he a man of God, a prayerful man? Does he bring you to Church or, do you bring him? Is your Dad going to be saved? Do you pray for him? What important life lessons has your Dad taught you so far? What lessons would you like him to teach you? Have you asked? Is your Dad your hero? Is he your example of a good father? Have you asked him everything that you wanted? Have you told him everything that you wanted? Do you really know him as he really is? You might be surprised.

You have probably read or heard this before, but it's an interesting reflection.... *"When I was a little child, my Dad was an awesome loving giant. When he took my little hand in his big hand I knew the world was safe and that.. it was mine! When I was ten, I knew that my Dad was the smartest man in the world and probably the strongest. He could do anything! When I was fourteen, my Dad was kind of goofy, but okay. I didn't spend as much time with him and he had a lot of work to do anyway. When I was seventeen, I realized that my Dad wasn't that great at all. In fact he was so embarrassing and out of touch with reality. There was times that I guess I even hated him (?) In my twenties I went off on my own and didn't have much time for him. He helped out financially sometimes, but I figured that he was just trying to stay in contact and probably have some control on my life. I'm in my forties now. I am embarrassed to say that I now kind of understand a lot of what he was trying to say. I really wish he was around. I'd love to bounce a few ideas off of him, hear what he thinks. But, he's gone. A couple of years ago..."*

Not a few of us don't have our Dad's around any more, as they completed this earthly journey at some point and have gone on to that next life. Some of us have come to peace with that, some have regrets or just miss him. We wish he was still around. Well, listen.... One thing we have learned a lot about from this *Pandemic* is the whole concept of "virtual" things... like meetings, graduations, trips and even prayer services. Why not shift that "virtual" into "spiritual" and have some spiritual experiences with your Dad!? When you go for a walk or a drive, ask your Dad to come along. When you pray ask him to pray with you. Maybe your Dad isn't a "saint", but when you ask the Saints to pray for you, especially in a time of need, especially for a family need, ask your Dad to pray for you too. Yes, he can! And, of course, don't ever forget to **pray for him**.

Today we celebrate fatherhood, by celebrating our Fathers. We do so by giving him a tie or socks or by inviting him for a meal or a coffee (that he might end up paying for?), but let us do something that is heartfelt and eternal - **1.** tell him (in words and/or actions) that you love him and appreciate what he does and tries to do, and **2.** raise a prayer for him from the depth of your soul, asking for the Lord to bless him, watch over him, grant him the grace to accomplish all of his hopes and dreams (that probably involve you anyway) and that he be welcomed into God's presence when the Lord so chooses. God bless you Dad! Thank you for everything!

What to do...

1. Offer a prayer of thanksgiving to the Lord that we are able to slowly return to our beloved parish church. AND pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and watch over our return that we will be cautious and that everyone will understand the importance of following the protocols.

2. Read the full text of the Archeparchial reopening **Covid-19 Directive #5** and the accompanying **Commentary** on the Archeparchial website at www.archeparchy.ca.

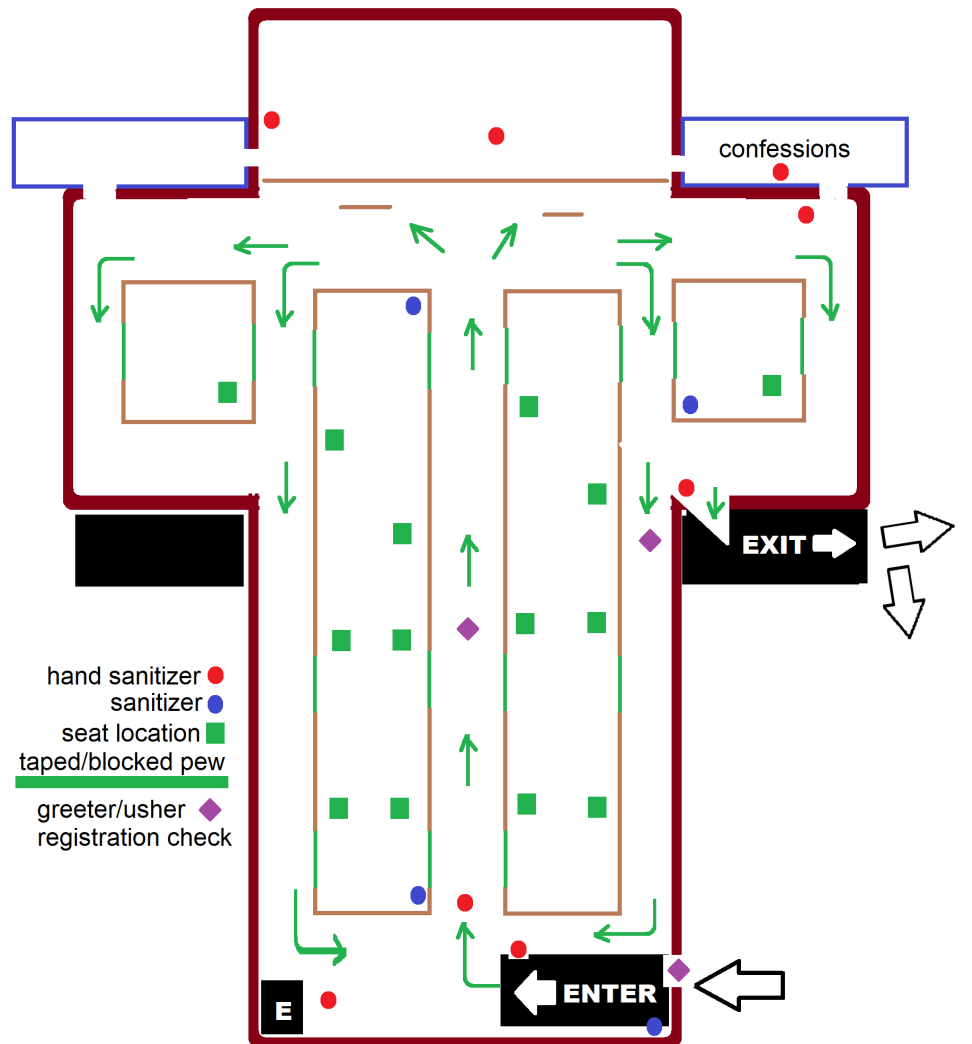
3. Ask yourself the usual safety **questions** and if, and only if, you can answer "No" to all four, and you would like to attend a service or visit the church, then call the parish to "preregister". The four questions are:
▶ Did I travel by air in the past two weeks? ▶ Have I been close to someone infected with COVID-19? ▶ Is anyone in my household quarantined or in isolation? ▶ Do I have a cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose, or sore throat?

4. You can **pre-register** to participate in a **Sunday Divine Liturgy** for yourself (and other family members) by calling the parish office **204-667-8866** and letting the Office Manager know or by leaving a message by the end of the office day on **THURSDAY**. You will need to clarify **which Divine Liturgy** you would like to attend [8:00 am or 10:00 am], **who** will be attending [name and contact number] and confirm that you can answer the **safety questions** negatively. As of today, **only 50 persons** (including clergy, singers and ushers) so when that number is met for each Liturgy, no more pre-registrations will be accepted. (*One option is to have more Liturgies - for example, an additional noon service - if warranted. We will see how that develops*)

5. It would be wise to arrive at the church **at least 10 minutes prior** to the service. (If others have expressed a desire to attend a certain liturgy and a pre-registered individual(s) has not arrived in time, the usher may admit another if he/she is able to confirm No. 3 above).

6. **Follow all the instructions** given by the ushers and the presiding member of the clergy. Keep in mind... use **hand sanitizer** when entering the church and when leaving.... keep at a **distance of 6-feet** from other individuals at all times... follow the directional **arrows** (*forward only up the middle and back only by the sides*)... sit only in "**open**" pews and at a spot tagged by **green tape**... individuals *from the same household* may sit in one pew... help to sanitize your own spot (seat and the top/back of the pew in front of you)... wearing a **mask** or having one to use is very much *encouraged*... there is **one entrance** and a **different exit**... (with the exception of those who need the handicap elevator)... **no socializing** can be permitted at this time in the church or in the church parking lot (there will be a time soon enough)...

It's not that complicated, but we want to be slow and sure and careful for everyone's sake...
