COVID-19 PROVISIONARY PARISH WEEKLY UPDATE - NO. 10

AS OUR PARISH FEAST APPROACHES: THE HOLY EUCHARIST...

“How did the underground Church [in Communist/totalitarian times] survive through the brutal conditions of persecution? Thanks to the Divine Liturgy, thanks to daily Holy Eucharist. This gave the Church the strength to survive the difficulties.” Priests in the underground took the risk every day of celebrating the Divine Liturgy. “The Divine Liturgy is unity with Christ. Priests were ready to be killed at any moment and wanted to do this united with God. That is why they offered the Divine Liturgy every day and received Holy Communion. They held their liturgies in different places. Often it was where they lived, in their apartments. They used whatever they had, as there were no vestments or beautiful chalices. He often only had an epitrahyl and, for a chalice, he used a glass or a metal cup if he had one. Proper communion bread, “prospora”, was not easy to come by. If they could, they would bake a large loaf and cut it into small pieces and let it dry, that way it could keep for a month” “The people would come daily asking the Priest for Holy Communion – even outside of the Divine Liturgy. Those who were unable to attend an actual Liturgy would listen to a broadcast of the Ukrainian Divine Liturgy from Vatican Radio that was able to pierce the Soviet radio waves. [Metropolitan Lawrence and several clergy now serving in the Archeparchy, including our parish priest Fr Michael, were among the seminarians that sang those live broadcasts of the Divine Liturgy from Rome to Eastern Europe].

That was the case for priests *before* arrest. “Priests who were sent to prison also recall the Divine Liturgy in the concentration camps, where priests and monks were forbidden to celebrate the Divine Liturgy. But even in Siberia, they found a way. For example, offered the Divine Liturgy every day! He did not have a separate room or some corner in which he could hide... so in the middle of the vast prison barracks he would sit on his bunk, cover up a bit with a blanket and offer the Divine Liturgy. Bread could be found, but there was no wine, so when the priests could get some raisins, they would let them soak in water overnight and the next day they would use that liquid as wine to celebrate the Liturgy.”

“These experiences from the underground days or the similar experience now with “field Masses” in the war on Eastern Ukraine (going on right now) are experiences that we should look at as they provide invaluable lessons about understanding the awesome and essential nature of the Holy Eucharist and what those that understand it, even a little, are willing to do to receive our Lord in Holy Communion and to do everything they can so that others have the opportunity...” (Material from a lecture by Fr. What to do...

1. Offer a prayer of thanksgiving to the Lord that we are able to slowly return to our beloved parish church. AND pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and watch over our return that we will be cautious and that everyone will understand the importance of following the protocols.

2. Read the full text of the Archeparchial reopening **Covid-19 Directive #5** and the accompanying **Commentary** on the Archeparchial website at www.archeparchy.ca.


3. Ask yourself the usual safety **questions** and if, and only if, you can answer "No" to all four, and you would like to attend a service or visit the church, then call the parish to "preregister". The four questions are:
▶ Did I travel by air in the past two weeks? ▶ Have I been close to someone infected with COVID-19? ▶ Is anyone in my household quarantined or in isolation? ▶ Do I have a cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose, or sore throat?

4. You can **pre-register** to participate in a **Sunday Divine Liturgy** for yourself (and other family members) by calling the parish office **204-667-8866** and letting the Office Manager know or by leaving a message by the previous Friday noon. (you can also use the **Eventbrite** app on the parish website. You will need to clarify **which Divine Liturgy** you would like to attend [8:00 am or 10:00 am], **who** will be attending [name and contact number] and confirm that you can answer the **safety questions** negatively. The limit at this time is **only 25 persons** (including clergy, singers and ushers) so when that number is met for each Liturgy, no more pre-registrations will be accepted. (One option is to have more Liturgies - for example, an additional noon service - if warranted. We will see how that develops)

5. Arrive at the church at **least 10 minutes prior** to the service. (If others have expressed a desire to attend a certain liturgy and a pre-registered individual(s) has not arrived in time, the usher may admit another if he/she is able to confirm No. 3 above).

6. **Follow all the instructions** given by the ushers and the presiding member of the clergy. Keep in mind... use **hand sanitizer** when entering the church and when leaving.... keep at a **distance of 6-feet** from other individuals at all times... follow the directional **arrows** (forward only up the middle and back only by the sides)... sit only in "**open**" pews and at a spot tagged by **green tape**... individuals from the same household may sit in one pew... help to sanitize your own spot (seat and the top/back of the pew in front of you)... wearing a **mask** or having one to use is very much *encouraged*... there is **one entrance** and a **different exit**... (with the exception of those who need the handicap elevator)... **no socializing** can be permitted at this time in the church or in the church parking lot (there will be a time soon enough)...

It's not that complicated, but we want to be slow and sure and careful for everyone's sake...
